6. Marine Police Update	
AB introduced himself and advised that Jamie Thornton had been moved back to Response. AB is now responsible for Ringstead through to Lyme from a marine crime aspect. AB has spoken to Amanada Anderson about	NM asked for AB to contact him regarding

Harbour Watch. There are currently 803 members registered for Harbour Watch across the whole county, although records show that only 6 of these people are in Lyme Regis. Membership of Harbour Watch is very heavy weighted in the east of the County, around the Christchurch/Poole area.

Adrian and Amanda happy to attend events, and all members of the HCG are keen to proactively drive sign ups, and to organise an event pre-season.

AB advised that new funding was allowing them to have two new vessels, which will enable them to come by water to West Dorset more often.

AB asked members to be aware of suspicious persons re outboard theft, ref persons that were stopped in Kent with outboards in vehicle that were stolen from Portland to be used in people trafficking.

availability of Police for Harbour Watch event dates. Ideal target date would be early April, during school holidays, but before Easter.

7. Harbours Advisory Group Committee Chair's Updates

RH reported that Ken Buchan is leaving Dorset Council at the end of April. Ken is well known by members and the group agreed that Ken had been a good friend and supporter of Lyme Regis and will be missed.

The advert is now live for two new non-elected members of the Harbours Advisory Committee. Closing date is 12th February, and we hope to appoint quickly. RH & NM encouraged members to consider if they were interested in applying.

8. Harbour Master Update

- JR Provided some statistics of Harbour usage in comparison from March 2024
- -Season Tickets 30% decrease.
- -Visiting craft 40% decrease
- -Boat Lifting remained the same
- -Parking 2% decrease
- -Shop decreased by 28%
- -Permanent mooring waiting list currently holds 13
- -Commercial waiting list currently holds 11
- -Mooring occupancy is currently at 65.5% private and 74.2% commercial. Waiting list offers have gone out, currently waiting responses.

NM asked if JR was concerned about vacancy figures. JR said that while the picture was not as he would wish, it comes off the back of two bad weather summer seasons, and more and more people giving up boats as they are not using them.

Members reported that the ongoing increase in cost of living is a factor, and that local car parking charges were of great concern and was affecting visitor numbers to the Town. Members acknowledged that while permits were available for locals, they do not benefit visitors.

No further update on HRO, we are still waiting to hear from Government on sign off. Once the HRO is in place, work will begin immediately to form a set of General Directions.

The new Harbour building is almost complete, just awaiting sign off now after a couple of defects have been resolved. The mezzanine floor will be added in the next financial year.

JR reported on dredging plans and investigating Water Injection Dredging. Members raised concerns that the plume from this would have a serious negative impact on the local reef systems. EC said that we were engaging with Natural England on this and organising surveys to collect baseline data. Modelling will also take place to predict the path of the sediment plume and

evaluate where sediment would settle. EC said the final decision on this has not yet been made; we are working through the process to ensure we are not causing damage to the environment. However, with the potential gains from a lower cost option like WID, it is something we are duty bound to investigate.

9. Phase 5 update

EC reported of 2024 progress and planned progress in 2025. Members reported that they are very concerned that nothing has happened seemingly in three years. Even though they keep raising the same concerns, nothing appears to change.

Members are requesting that further action be taken in escalating their concerns. Officers recommended that a formal question be posed at the next HAC.

NM will liaise with members to frame a question regarding Phase 5 to be included in the next HAC agenda. Question to be emailed to Josh Kennedy.
